

Duane Cornell U. S. Navy Pea Coat (Artifact 109)

Artifact

This coat is believed to have been worn by Duane Cornell who served as a Second Class Photographer in the United States Navy during World War II. He was a member of the Atlantic Fleet Camera Group. Cornell was the son of Alonzo C. and Esther Kunde Cornell of Lincoln, Nebraska. He attended Shelton Academy and later Union College (1939-1941) where he participated in the Medical Cadet Corp for one year.

Provenance

This coat was given to Union College in April 2011 by Louesa Peters (Class of 1948) who obtained it in the 1950s when she lived in an apartment owned by Mrs. Cornell.
